On Thursday, December 7, the City of Hartford will begin operating a no-freeze shelter plan that includes Center Church! On Wednesdays-Sundays from 4:00pm-7:00pm, we will be a Triage Center where those without homes can come to receive help connecting with safe and warm places to sleep as well as a meal. The meal is where you come in. We need volunteers to prepare a meal (food will be supplied) Wednesday-Saturday evenings from December to April! (Sunday dinners are already covered under our regular meal program). That's a lot of dinners! Until we hire a new Warburton Outreach Director (we hope by January), we will need someone who can lock up on Thurs, Fri and Sat. nights. **If you can help with any of this, please contact Shelly or Bill Warner-Prouty ASAP! CHRISTMAS EVE IS A SUNDAY THIS YEAR! That means several things for the life of the church about which you will read in this newsletter. One of them involves our weekly Sunday dinner for those in need in our community. The dinner will still happen, now a little earlier (2-5) so the guests can attend our Christmas Eve service if they wish! Our dinner coordinator, Dani Soto, and her family are cooking, but could use some help. If you can, come and volunteer before you come to worship! Help some folk who really need a little Christmas to have some this year!

CHRISTMAS EVE IS A SUNDAY THIS YEAR, PART II! HOMELESS MEMORIAL SERVICE: Once again this year, Center will host the Memorial Service for those in Hartford’s homeless community who have died. On Thursday, December 21, the longest night of the year, at 6:30pm we will gather in the Meeting House to sing and pray together. Please join us.

Night Angels and News from the Outreach Board

It was the day before Thanksgiving and the ground floor of the Church House was alive with the energy of 30 middle and high school volunteers from Hartford and environs, plus 15 adult cooks and supervisors, moms, and dads. All were preparing and serving a bounteous dinner to 114 guests in an atmosphere that rocked with the beat and the music of a volunteer DJ and his son. As one guest commented, “What do you have going here, a ‘Soup Kitchen’ or a ‘Club?’” While our guests were relaxing with snacks, pastries, coffee, and tea, they were each invited, by number, into the Warburton Room, where cold weather coats, scarves, blankets, hygiene kits, etc. were set out to “purchase” with the ticket given at the door. By 7:00pm, the place was cleaned and clear, and everyone left full, a little tired, but most importantly, fulfilled through an afternoon of shared hospitality, sanctuary, and cheer!

Also note that, between October 15 and November 19, with the kitchen/dining hall supervision of Ms. Danielle Soto, our Community Sunday Dinner program has served 269 friends and neighbors, with the help of the Newington UCC Youth Outreach Group, the Wish School Teen Outreach Program, the Connecticut Heat Girls Basketball Team, and our Center Church Faith Formation young people, along with the Rios family and friends.

As the winter months come upon us, we hope to expand our compassionate hospitality and assistance through the Hartford No Freeze initiative and the help of a new Director of Outreach.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Thanks to you, we have passed the \$500,000 mark in donations. With the \$250,000 grant from Partners for Sacred Places and \$50,000 from the State of CT Historic Preservation Office, we are now at \$800,000! Hallelujah! However, our project will cost over \$1.8 million, so we have a ways to go! As we prepare to ask Foundations and Corporate giving offices, we need to say that we have donations from nearly 100% of our congregation. SUNDAY MORNING ADULT EDUCATION CLASS AT 8:45 a.m.
October 31, 1517 ~ 500th Anniversary of the Reformation

For the last few weeks we have been discussing Reformation basics and the role of the Bible. Our study guide refers to the following three things as “Reformation Basics”:

1. The Sovereignty of God
2. Salvation by Grace
3. The Priesthood of All Believers

With respect to the Bible, our study guide observes that the Reformation found energy and inspiration in Scripture. In our discussion of “Sola Scriptura”, one of the questions asked in our study guide is: Do you think that Scripture is the only way to learn about God, the first and foremost way, or not a way at all?

If you are interested in learning more about Martin Luther but are unable to come to class, you may be interested in watching a PBS documentary. YEAR-END PLEDGE PAYMENTS AND 2018 INFO. It is once again that time of year when we must remind you of the cut-off date for receiving your pledge payments in order for them to qualify for Year 2017 tax deductions. According to the IRS guidelines, all payments must be dated in 2017 and received or postmarked by **December 31st** for them to qualify as 2017 deductible charitable contributions. That means that **Sunday, December 31st** is the last Sunday that you can put your pledge payments in the plate and have them count for 2017. All pledges received must be **postmarked by December 31st** to be posted as received in Year 2017. As always, thank you for your generosity.
