The adult education class will resume on January 12. We will continue with the series from Diana Butler Bass on *Embracing Spiritual Awakening*, in which she addresses the dynamics of experiential faith. One religious leader made the following observation about *Embracing Spiritual Awakening*:

Embracing Spiritual Awakening invites participants to examine and understand the changing cultural landscape in North America. Is the oft-heard critique of declining numbers in congregations simply a canard of those who would prefer a world of families with many children and stay-at-home mothers, or is it the consequence of increasing ethnic and cultural and religious diversity around us? Or is it something else? Diana Butler Bass leads a discussion of what is meant to be spiritual, to be religious, and how Christians today might be grace-filled witnesses to the reality they know and experience.



- 2014-2016 Capital Campaign
- January-December 2014: Develop revised cost and scope of work (consider single phase to avoid cost duplication and one Capital Campaign)
- May 2014: Begin work on the Connecticut Historical Grant (with help of architect and consultant)
- October 2014: Submit CT Historical Grant Request (\$200,000)
- December 2014: Submit plan to Stewards
- January 2015: Submit plan to Prudential
- February 2015: Submit plan to Congregation
- February 2015: Notice of award of CT Historical Grant
- March 2015: Congregation discuss plan
- June 2015: Congregation votes to proceed
- January 2016: Bidding of sub-contracts
- March-November 2016: Estimated construction period

"Today is Rebecca's last day with us - for at least six months. Tomorrow she goes off to Peru in answer to a call she felt deeply touched by when she was there last summer. While

with us, she has supervised breakfasts, organized coffees, added Thursday lunches to our schedule when Hands on Hartford could not manage alone to provide them, distributed funds to the needy - there's a very long list that includes scrubbing the kitchen floor!

She has consistently challenged us to freshen our interpretation of what it means to be a downtown church. Most importantly, she has freely given her compassion, friendship and her buoyant humor in deeply personal ways to members both inside our community and in the larger community around us. Through Rebecca, more people now know that Center Church cares.

We will see her every six months, when she returns to keep her visa terms in order. We look forward to hearing from her, and hope that our cause and hers will intertwine, that her mission and ours come together. Who knows? Maybe on one of these wintry days in the future, some of us will be headed for Peru?



Introducing...Electronic Funds Transfer Services!



Beginning in 2014, the Finance Office is excited to offer you additional options for the payment of Pledges, for donations to Disaster Relief efforts and for purchases such as Concert Tickets, Auction items and more.

Center Church is now a member of the Vanco Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) system. This system allows the payment of your pledge through equal monthly withdrawals (full or partial years based on when you complete an authorization form and choose to start your monthly withdrawal). Your choice of withdrawal date can be on the 1st or the 15th of the month and your pledge payment can be withdrawn from your checking or savings account, without fees.

An authorization form and instructions for this convenient service is available from the Church Office or via email. Once the office enters your information into the online, secure Vanco site your forms will be stored in a secure file in the Church Office. The authorization remains in effect until you terminate the authorization or change the payment method, the payment frequency or \$ amount. At your request your withdrawal can also be put "on hold" and restarted at a later date. Since participation in the passing of the plate for your pledge payment is an important part of the worship service, cards will be available for pickup in the Narthex that can be put in the plate in lieu of envelopes. These cards signify that you are paying your pledge through EFT.

A website option will be available in the coming months for donations to Disaster Relief efforts and for purchases such as Concert Tickets, Auction items and more. This option will be available to you by accessing the Church's website, following the Vanco link to the donation form and following the instructions. Using this method requires you to choose your payment purpose and enter your payment information (debit/credit card information, checking or savings, \$ amount). Use of the online service carries a processing fee for your transaction. More information will be coming to you when this additional service is available.
