As some of you know, I am a huge Star Wars fan. Yes, my kids' names are Luke, Leah, and Ben (all Bible names, and Leah's is pronounced, but not spelled, like the Princess). We enjoyed it immensely, and I found it to have a depth at times that was, dare I say, *theological!*

One line in particular stood out for further reflection. The new character, Rose Tico, says "We win not by destroying what we hate, but by saving what we love." One might argue that there are things out there that need to be destroyed, all those "-isms" that continue to wreak such havoc on so many. But ultimately, I think she is right, we *win* by a focus not on destruction and hate, but on love, on saving. It strikes me that this sums up the life and teaching of Jesus in many ways. ### **CENTER'S PART OF HARTFORD NO-FREEZE PROGRAM**

As you have heard, Center Church is the host for 5 days a week for the Triage Center for this program. That means that Wed.-Sun. each week through March, from 4-7pm, case workers meet people in need of shelter in our downstairs dining room so they can link them with safe places to spend the night and other services they may need. Our role, in addition to providing the space, is to provide a very simple meal to feed 30-40 people, using food supplied by the city (supplemented occasionally by the cooks), to be served at about 5pm. Sundays, the usual supper program provides that meal. Deckie Jeffers will keep the schedule until our new Outreach Director starts, so if you and friends (it really takes about 3 people to set up, keep coffee going, cook and serve and clean-up) want to take an evening, contact Deckie. Right now, Wednesdays are most in need of help. Thanks to David, Dennis, Holly, Deckie, Shelly, Kathryn Lewis, Catherine Maclean, Richard, Dani, Alan, Anne, and various friends and family who have already cooked and served. Ask us for more info!

**Annual Meeting and Annual Report  
at Center Church in 1917: 100 Years Ago!**

In 1917, as in other years before and after, a Year Book was published. It was a combination of the 1917 Annual Report and Church Directory. It also included information on church staff, programs, schedules, committees, and their members.

Sunday worship was at 10:30 AM, but there was also a Vesper Service at 4:00 PM, and there was a regular Thursday night meeting. The Annual Meeting was held on the fourth Friday in January. The Minister (The Rev. Dr. Rockwell Harmon Potter) seemed to be on every committee and delegation. Many of the church officers and committees were the same as we have now, but two were different. There was a Church Seating Committee. We were still renting pews as a way to fund the church budget; so, it was important that people sat where they were supposed to. Pew rentals brought in \$11,350 that year. The total church budget was about \$45,000. Another committee was Decorations. Guess what? All the members were women; whereas, the church officers, deacons and other elected committee members were men. The church program was extensive: Sunday School, four women's groups, a young people's group (50 members), a men's group, the camp on Columbia Lake, and Warburton Chapel. It appears that all these programs had committees with officers, budgets, and extensive activities throughout the year.

The Year Book contained many facts and figures about church membership, benevolence offerings, and lists of delegates to special gatherings. The most important report in this 1917 Year Book was about the Great War (WWI). 69 Center Church men were already on active duty and both the U.S. flag and the service flag were displayed on our church buildings. The Meeting House was closed to save on coal; worship was held in the Church House. The women's groups sewed for the Red Cross, and special offerings were held to support French orphans. And, of course, there were sermons and programs related to the war.

In 1917, there was an extensive restoration program at the Meeting House. It was now 110 years old and needed a new slate roof, reconstruction of the portico, and removal of the white paint which had covered the brick for nearly 90 years. There was also work at the Church House and the Parsonage. The total cost came in under the \$25,000 budgeted.

Dr. Potter was on sick leave for nearly half of 1917, and it was during this time that the First Congregational Church of Los Angeles, CA tried to entice him westward to become their minister. He stayed another 11 years with us. In 1917, we worshipped and looked to God for strength in that time of trouble. We served those in need and supported each other. One hundred years later, we are still called to be faithful servants. While much has changed, much has stayed the same.
