



+ From the Pastor +

In the early days of our nation, most Congregational Churches, like ours, held Election Sermons. Pastors preached to people about the importance of voting, and sometimes, clearly steered them to particular issues or people that the Pastor felt they needed to support or reject! You can find whole books of these sermons, and if we searched our vault, I suspect some of our early preachers delivered them as well.

I'm not going to do that on the first Sunday in November, but I do want to say here one simple thing: VOTE! It is stunning to me that in a nation where people fought and died for the right to vote, less than half of eligible voters usually cast a ballot in any election, including Presidential elections! 2016 broke records for how many people voted, yet the total was only *58% of eligible voters!*

Elections include ballot propositions, which often have ethical dimensions. The people we elect have the power to create policy that impacts our spiritual and ethical, as well as economic and social, lives. The choices we make at the ballot need to reflect our faith values as well as party preferences. Remember that Hitler was actually elected in Germany.

My Election Sermon is this: be informed, learn about candidates and issues, ask them hard questions if they come seeking your vote, and then get to your polling place on November 6! If you need a ride, contact the church and we'll see what we can do. And yes, in the last election we learned that one vote can make a difference! Get out there this year and BE the difference!
