Starting October 15th: 500th Anniversary of the Reformation

We will be using a study guide prepared by the Stillspeaking Writers' Group. The following is from the Foreword:

The Protestant Reformation began 500 years ago. None of us lived before it. Some of the life-threatening, flabbergasting ideas that exploded out of those years are now a part of the air we breathe. 500 years ago people died for them. But time turns the revolutionary into the everyday. We take key Reformation claims for granted. We can't even see them; they're just a part of who are.

Other Reformation claims are covered in dust, obscured and stuck away in a neglected corner of the church, like a long-forgotten Van Gogh languishing under wraps in someone's attic.

This study guide celebrates the United Church of Christ's Reformation heritage by lifting up some of the Reformation's central claims. There is beauty here. And ugliness, too. Inasmuch as ideas can thrill, these ideas are thrilling. Brace yourself.

You have hearts and minds for justice and want Center Church to be a place of gathering and empowerment. You dream beyond your size, which is how God works in all of us when we open ourselves to the Spirit. Dream with me and let me know what you see as we move together to serve God, Hartford, and each other.

WHAT IS "READ TO SUCCEED"?

READ TO SUCCEED is a highly effective literacy program for working adults whose chances for advancement in our economy are hindered by their being stuck in a K-6th grade level of reading and writing ability. State cutbacks and changes in the Hartford Public Library space allocations have brought the program to our doorstep. In August, Deckie Jeffers, a *RTS* volunteer, arranged a meeting with the Read to Succeed Director, Mark Purcell, in the Warburton Room. It was clear that the WROCC's reconfiguration of this room also created an ideal location for tutoring during 2-3 days/week. The Outreach Board unanimously endorsed the program, making the WROCC available for its use and support. A proposal has been prepared by Mark Purcell and Gail Rosin, head tutor, for presentation to the Stewards and Prudential. If all goes well, we hope to see **READ TO SUCCEED** resuming its program in the Warburton Room in early October.
