I am part of a group of clergy and lay people who meet regularly and have developed materials for churches on a couple of topics. We are now working on the subject of "discernment." We think of it broadly: for individuals throughout their lives as well as for organizations, institutions, and workplaces. Our organizer asked us to put together a one-sentence definition of discernment, and I came up with this (decidedly run-on) sentence: *"Discernment is listening with ears, eyes, spirit, and heart to God, other people, the earth, your gut, and then coming to clarity on moving in one direction or another."*

A number of you who attended our June retreat have asked when we might have another one. We will have two "mini-retreats" for people who missed the first one or want to work again on the kind of discernment we did that day. We are also planning to do a retreat sometime after Christmas, pushing this idea of discernment even further. We will do some exercises that we can use to think about both Center Church or open questions in our own lives.

How do you go about discerning what to do when faced with major issues in life? Are you interested in exploring further what that might mean? Let me know if you are, or if there is another topic you would like to spend a morning or longer on with members of Center Church. We will also do some of this kind of conversation at the "First Tuesdays at Shelly's Apartment" evenings. No matter when, let's talk!

NEW BY-LAWS TAKE EFFECT!

On October 1, our new by-laws are in effect! A quick reminder of what that means:

- Our former governing board, known as Prudential, is now the Coordinating Executive Team (CET). CET will meet monthly for most of the year and is the ONLY elected group in the church.
- Our Boards and Committees are now "teams," and have been redefined.
- Current teams are: Worship, Care, Resource, Outreach, Community Relations, Faith Formation, Visionary.
- New sub-teams will be forming as well.
- If you have an idea for a team and will be part of it, suggest it to the CET.
- Some teams will be time or event specific, and not ongoing.
- We will need to tolerate a little "creative chaos" as the teams get organized. Things may not always be done the way they were before! We will be tweaking the structure throughout this year.
- WE NEED YOU to be on a team! This structure works best if everyone is involved in some way. TEAMS ARE NOT ELECTED! YOU JUST VOLUNTEER! No set term, but we ask that if you volunteer for a team, you agree to stay for one year at least or until after the event for a short-term team. Watch the newsletter, e-news, and announcements in worship for opportunities to work with a team.
