AFFIRMATION OF FAITH AND RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Minister: Friends, baptism is a moment in the Christian community when we recognize the grace of God among us. Baptism is an act of naming and knowing our identity as followers of Christ. Baptism is a recommitment that we make individually and communally to love God and to live in the unity of the Spirit. Today, I invite you to recall the promises of your own baptism, made either by you or on

your behalf by your parents and loved ones when you were still an infant.

People: Let us affirm once again the faith of the Church in which we all

have been baptized.

Minister: Do you believe in God, our Maker?

People: We believe in God, Creator of all that is visible and invisible.

God is in our midst calling us to care for one another and to

work for justice and peace.

Minister: Do you believe in the Son of God, our Lord and Savior?

People: We believe in Jesus Christ, God-with-us. He was conceived by

the power of the Holy Spirit and was born of Mary's womb. Jesus walked the roads of Galilee, healed the sick, befriended the poor, comforted the broken-hearted and proclaimed the Good News. He was condemned by the guardians of religious rules, was crucified by the political establishment, died and was buried. On the third day, Christ was raised and now he is with the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Minister: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

People: We believe in the Holy Spirit, who is as close to us as our

heartbeat. The Spirit spoke through the prophets and apostles and continues to inspire us to follow Christ. The Spirit calls us into the holy catholic church, to acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and to hope for the resurrection of the

body and the life everlasting with God.

Minister: Do you renew and affirm the promises made at your baptism?

People: We do, with God's help.

Minister: Do you recognize the call of God to be God's people always?

People: We do.

Minister: Do you embrace the way of Jesus in faith and ministry?

People: We do, with God's help.

Minister: Do you accept the guidance of the Holy Spirit who renews your

spirit each day?

People: We do.

Minister: In renewing your baptismal vows, remember your baptism as a

mark of acceptance and welcome into the care of Christ's church

where you may begin again your Christian faith and life.

Those who would like to renew their baptismal vows are invited to come forward, as they are able, to receive water from the font on their foreheads as a sign of reaffirmation of their baptism.
