### Do You Have a Story to Share?

In the old days, they were called "testimonies." Very simply, it is a story where you saw God at work in your life or in the world. Doesn't have to be long, in fact it would help to keep it to 5-8 minutes. We are planning to have a service of testimonies on May 5. If you have a story you would be willing to share, let Shelly know.

Many years ago, when South African blacks were trapped in the unjust apartheid system of government, I heard a South African pastor say that on Easter their church was not crowded at all. But on Good Friday, it was packed. She said that her people understood suffering and pain and unjust courts and dangerous soldiers, quick to use their weapons. The story of Jesus' crucifixion touched them deeply in their own places of pain, fear, and suffering. She said they had trouble with Easter, because they just couldn't see Resurrection yet.

That story stuck with me, because I know that some people right here in Greater Hartford would resonate with those feelings. Maybe even some folk in our congregation. To you I say, come on Maundy Thursday night and enter into this story of Jesus. Come on Friday at noon if you can and walk a procession of lament down Main Street. Remember that God knows your pain and holds you in the midst of it.

I also know that some folk in our congregation readily enter into the joy of the Resurrection as the epitome of the hope that good is stronger than evil. As the psalmist writes, "Joy comes in the morning," especially that morning, unexpected and miraculous. God still acts in the world that way, and if our eyes, spirits, minds, and hearts are open to seeing it, joy floods us daily.

To all of you I say, come on Easter and hear each other's struggles and joys, despairs and hopes, and claim the story of God's bodacious and powerful love as your own. If you cannot see it yet, like Thomas, cling to those who have seen and believe. If you believe wholeheartedly, be on the watch for those who hang back in their alleluias and reach out a hand in support and prayer. We are the Body of Christ: rising and risen. In the words of Bruce Springsteen, "Come on up for the rising!"

## ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

On Sunday, March 24, about 40 people gathered (out of a membership of about 160, by the way) for our Annual Meeting, most of which was spent determining the priorities we choose for defining our mission as a church into the future. We prioritized the “big ideas” from the retreat, and the one with the most support was “*Putting Center Church back in the Center of Hartford.*” The group at the retreat defined that this way:

### PUT CENTER CHURCH IN THE CENTER OF HARTFORD: SPIRITUALLY, SOCIALLY, MORALLY, ETHICALLY

- Establish a system/network for collaboration and communication with neighbors (businesses, churches, institutions, politicians, etc.)
- Be the resource and share the resources for ministries that serve all our neighbors
- Get to know our neighbors/Identify who they are
- Establish a team with this focus to develop an action plan
- Establish an action plan team to implement
- Hire a staff member to direct and get us engaged
- Create a dialogue with millennials and GenZ

The CET will review and make recommendations for moving ahead, but are **particularly interested in building the team suggested!** If you would like to be part of this team, please speak to Rev. Shelly or Cheryl Thomas.
