

# Sunday Adult Education Faith Formation Classes

After Worship, on the first floor  
of the Church House.

On September 15, we began discussing some of the issues being talked about in connection with *The 1619 Project*, and in addition, the life of Reverend James W.C. Pennington, who was one of the early ministers of the Talcott Street Church. *The 1619 Project* is a project of The New York Times that takes its name from the fact that in August 1619 enslaved Africans were first bought to Virginia, and you can read about it online.

Questions for this week:

1. How did you first learn about the history of slavery in the U.S.? What did you learn, and how was that information presented?
2. What do you see as the lasting legacy of slavery in the U.S.?
3. What do you know about the contributions of black Americans to U.S. society, and where does that information come from?
4. Referring to the text of the Declaration of Independence, answer the following questions:
  - o What are the values stated in the Declaration of Independence?
  - o In what ways can you see those values working in contemporary American life? In what ways can you see them failing?
  - o How has the interpretation of those values changed over time? Who is responsible for creating those changes?

After discussing these questions, we will discuss the essay entitled “The Idea of America”. The guiding questions for that essay are as follows:

1. How have laws, policies, and systems developed to enforce the enslavement of black Americans before the Civil War influenced laws, policies, and systems in years since?
2. How has activism by black Americans throughout U.S. history led to policies that benefit all people living in the U.S.?

## **SUPPORTING CENTER CHURCH BY MAKING A FINANCIAL PLEDGE FOR 2020**

If you still want to put something in the offering plate, there are cards on the rear table in the sanctuary that say you have already given.
4. Unless you choose EFT, a box of envelopes will be prepared for you to use. These will be available at the rear of the sanctuary near the end of the year. Please use the envelopes that have been purchased for your use and include your pledge number.
5. Have you ever thought about including Center Church in your will? If you’d like to speak with someone about doing that, contact the Church Office at any time.
6. Does your employer have a matching gifts program that includes religious institutions? If so, please check with the staff person where you work and also circle “Yes” on the card. If your employer does not contribute to religious organizations, consider an extra gift to the 1636 Heritage Partnership for the maintenance and preservation of our historic buildings.
7. Remember that this is not a legal contract; if your financial situation changes, you can reduce or increase your pledge as the need arises.

**FREE PARKING** is available during Sunday Worship Services at the Travelers Plaza Garage off Prospect Street (next to the Hartford Club.) The garage closes at 1:00pm (12:00pm during Summer services). On-street parking is also available on Gold Street and on the west side of Lewis Street, and is **FREE** on Sundays.

**REST ROOMS** are located in the basement of the Meeting House. Please use the stairs in the southeast corner of the building. For safety, please have an adult accompany your child to the restroom.

**CHURCH SCHOOL** is held at the Church House (60 Gold Street) for preschool to 12<sup>th</sup> Grade. Children are to remain with their families in the Meeting House during worship until they depart for Church School following the Children's Moment. Please pick your child up promptly at 12:00pm. For their safety, children will remain with their Church School instructor until an adult picks them up.

**CHILDCARE and NURSERY** care are provided by trained, capable, and nurturing staff and volunteers, and is available in the Meeting House basement for infants and toddlers (up to two years of age.) A nursery without staff is also located on the second floor of the Church House.

**CURRENT SUNDAY ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CLASSES** are held in the Church House (60 Gold Street) at Noon. Announcements regarding Adult Education classes are announced in our publications.

**HANDICAPPED ACCESS** to the sanctuary is via the lift outside at the south end of the portico. If possible, please call the church office in advance for assistance in using the lift.
