WELCOME to Center Church!

LITANY: WE GATHER TO LEARN TO LOVE AS GOD LOVES Reader One:

Who knows about Ellis Island? Who knows about Angel Island? Beginning in 1876 there was a great effort made in our nation to bring about the erection of the Statue of Liberty, and it was dedicated in 1886. Its official name is Liberty Enlightening the World. We learned that the Chinese Exclusion Act, passed in 1882, was our first federal law to single out an entire group for exclusion from our country based on race or ethnicity. Ben Franklin had referred to Germans as "swarms of swarthy aliens who herd together". A minister in Boston had called the Irish "the most ignorant and barbarian race", and they were considered to be such a threat that riots against them broke out in American cities.

Foreshadowing the 1921 Tulsa massacre, rioters attacked the Chinese community in Los Angeles in the 1870's, lynching 17 Chinese men and boys, including a prominent doctor.

But the Chinese Exclusion Act was passed to maintain "white racial purity".

Response:

Each of us and each of "them", whoever "they" may be, is a beloved child of God. When will we ever learn?

Reader Two:

Who knows about the Jim Crow laws or the Trail of Tears? Who knows about the Chinese Exclusion Act? In 1870, the 15th Amendment to our Constitution recognized the voting rights of African American men; and in 1920, the 19th Amendment recognized at long last the suffrage rights of women. We learned that Professor Erika Lee's father was such a big fan of President Franklin D. Roosevelt that he named his Brooklyn restaurant the "New Deal" -- even though he could not vote. Why? Because by the 1930's all Asians were barred from the United States and, if they were already here, from becoming naturalized citizens--and only citizens can vote. Poll taxes and literacy tests were made illegal by the Voting Rights Act of 1965, but in 2013, the North Carolina legislature requested data, by race, on the use of a number of voting practices, and then implemented stringent new voting restrictions with the intent to discriminate against Black voters.

Response:

For what we have done, God forgive us.

Reader Three:

World War II is sometimes referred to as a war for democracy. We learned that the 442nd Infantry Regiment, whose members were Nisei (born in the United States to parents who immigrated from Japan), became the most highly decorated unit in our military history—while their families were being held in internment camps by their own country. Like African American soldiers (such as the Tuskegee Airmen) and Native American soldiers (such as the Navajo Code Talkers), they were willing to fight and die for democracy abroad while being denied their democratic rights at home.

Response:

God looks at our hearts, not our outward appearances. Help us to do the same.

Reader Four:

The election of President Obama was a significant milestone, as is the service of Vice President Harris, on the road to racial justice; and in 2015, the Supreme Court struck down state bans on same-sex marriage. We learned that the long, ugly history of anti-Asian racism and violence is not just in our country's past. As of this March, anti-Asian hate crimes had spiked 150% since the beginning of the pandemic. In 2019, the FBI found that hate crimes were on the rise, that nearly 1 in 5 hate crimes was motivated by anti-LGBTQ bias, and that the number of victims of anti-Latino or Hispanic hate crimes had risen over 21% from the prior year. One commentator observed that we are having a "democratization of hate".

Response: O God, forgive us.

CALL TO A SPECIAL MEETING


Sunday July 11 during worship

For their safety, children will remain with their Church School instructor until an adult picks them up. Church School is not held during the Summer.
