## SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Pastor: Members and friends in Christ, we gather now to celebrate the gift of grace in the

sacrament of baptism.

People: There is one body and one Spirit. There is one hope in God's call to us.

Pastor: Jesus came to John to be baptized by him. But John tried to make him change his

mind. "I ought to be baptized by you," John said, "yet you have come to me!"

People: Jesus said, "Let it be so for now. For in this way, we shall do all that God

requires." So John agreed.

Pastor: As soon as Jesus was baptized, he came up out of the water. Then heaven was

opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God coming down like a dove and lighting

on him.

People: Then a voice said from heaven, "This is my own dear Son, with whom I am well

pleased."

Pastor: At another time Jesus said: Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in

the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Baptism is the sacrament through which we are united to Jesus Christ and given part in Christ's

ministry of reconciliation. Baptism is a visible sin of an invisible event: the

reconciliation of people to God. It shows the death of self and the rising to a life of obedience and praise. It shows also the pouring out of the Holy spirit of those whom God has chosen. In baptism, God works in us the power of forgiveness, the renewal

of the Spirit, and the knowledge of the call to be God's people always.

People: This is the water of baptism. Out of this water, we rise with new life, forgiven of

sin and one in Christ, members of Christ's body.

Leader: On Mother's Day, let us remember that this day is marked with joy or sadness or a

People: We give our loving God thanks and praise.

Leader: For all women who are marginalized, vulnerable, worried, exhausted, and frustrated,

People: We pray that these measures keep us safe and well.

Leader: For the women who do not feel safe in their home,

People: We pray for healing in reconciliation or in healthier boundaries.

Leader: For children whose mothers have died, that live no longer together, and for mothers

who grieve, who have lost children born or unborn,

People: We weep with those with broken hearts and comfort those who mourn.

Leader: For those who are raising children, who are supported by spouse and family, and

those who are struggling to do it all on their own,

People: We pray that we may be their community, offering real help in hard times.

Leader: For those who are preparing to have emptier nests, who hope they have raised

children strong enough to fly into the world and back home to visit.

People: We both celebrate and mourn with you.

Leader: For stepmothers, navigating the pitfalls and pleasures of creating a new family,

People: We pray for wisdom, patience, grace, and love.

Leader: For Grandmothers who are doing the hard work of raising children again, for aunts

and sisters and all of those who have taken on a parenting role,

People: We pray for caregivers, offering our care for them too.

Leader: For those who are waiting and sometimes struggling with the biological process to

bring new life, and for those who are waiting for the adoptive process to be fulfilled.

People: We wait with you, listening to your joys and sorrows along the way.

Leader: For same sex couples raising children,

People: We pray for acceptance and love.

Leader: For women who do not have children, but instead teach, lead, care for, and guide the
