Reflection & Discussion Questions

1.	What are the "locusts" in your life or in our world today, and how might God be working to restore what has been lost?
	☐ Joel 2:25–27 – "I will restore to you the years that the swarming locust has eaten"
	→ Reflect on personal or communal experiences of loss. Where can you already see signs of healing or restoration?
2. co	How does the presence of God bring healing—not just to individuals, but also to whole mmunities?
	☐ Revelation 22:1–4 – "The river of the water of life flowed from the throne of God the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations."
	→ Consider the connection between God's presence and the restoration of justice, peace, and community.
3. Но	In what ways are we called to move toward suffering and injustice, rather than turn away? ow can this be a path to healing for others and ourselves?
	☐ Isaiah 58:6–8 – "Is not this the fast that I choose… to loose the bonds of injustice… then your healing shall spring up quickly."
	→ What does it look like in your life to stand in solidarity with those who are hurting?
4.	What does it mean to become an agent of restoration in today's broken world?
	☐ Micah 6:8 – "What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God?"
	→ Reflect on practical steps you or your community can take to reflect God's healing in social, ecological, or political ways.
