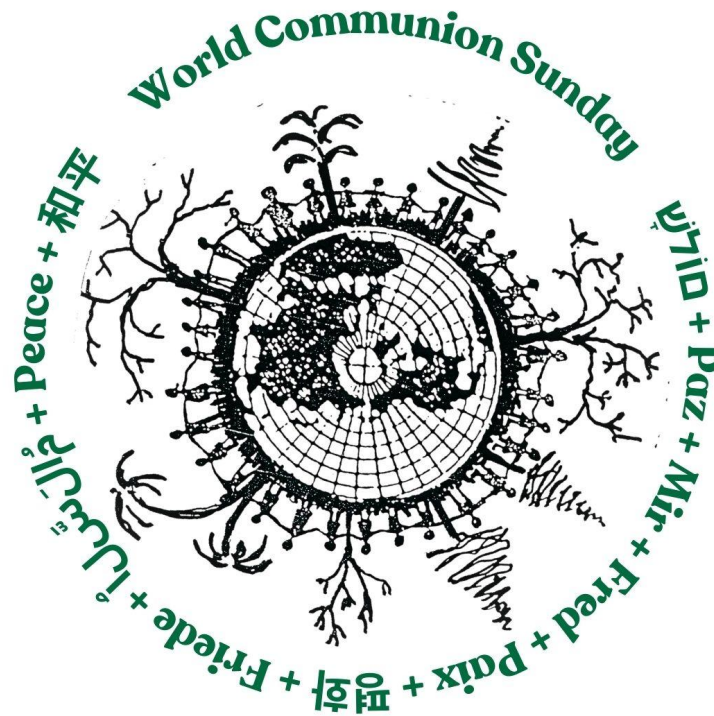

Fall Updates

The Visionary Team has identified three areas for our community to focus on in the coming program year, based on notes from our May church retreat:

- Increase the engagement of children in worship in multiple ways.
- Create a short-term Faith Formation Strategy Team to create a vision for our ministries with children and youth. The team would work starting in September, would make budget recommendations for the congregational budget meeting in November, and would report to the congregation at our Annual Meeting next spring. *We commissioned this working group in worship on Sunday. They will have their first meeting this week and will meet regularly through November.*
- Start a small group to move forward with exploring the creation of a 501(c)(3) that will help support our ministries with folks in transition. *This group held their first meeting last week. More updates to come!*

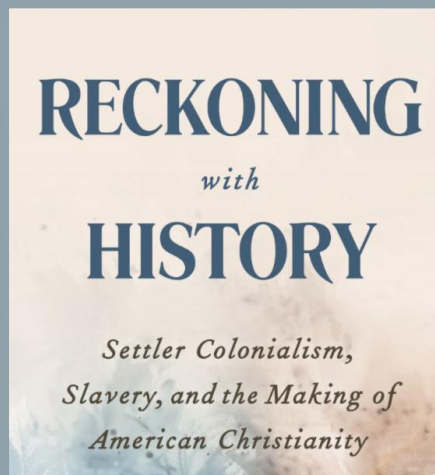

Celebrate 25 Years of ONA at Immanuel UCC



Our sister congregation, Immanuel UCC, is celebrating 25 years of ONA this year! To celebrate they've invited a number of speakers to join them. The first event is October 17, 2025 at 7 PM, and they've invited Attorney Jennifer L. Levi from GLAD Law.

Jennifer L. Levi is the Senior Director of Transgender and Queer Rights and a nationally recognized expert on transgender legal issues. Levi led the legal fight against President Trump's transgender military ban in both *Doe v. Trump* and *Stockman v. Trump*. Levi has also been a leader in working on harm reduction for incarcerated transgender people. Levi was co-counsel in two landmark marriage equality cases, winning the freedom to marry for same-sex couples in Massachusetts (*Goodridge v. Department of Public Health*, 2003) and Connecticut (*Kerrigan v. Department of Public Health*, 2008).

Through strategic litigation, public policy advocacy, and education, GLBTQ Legal Advocates & Defenders (GLAD Law) works in New England and nationally to create a just society free of discrimination based on gender identity and expression, HIV status, and sexual orientation.

First, Person-Centered approach.

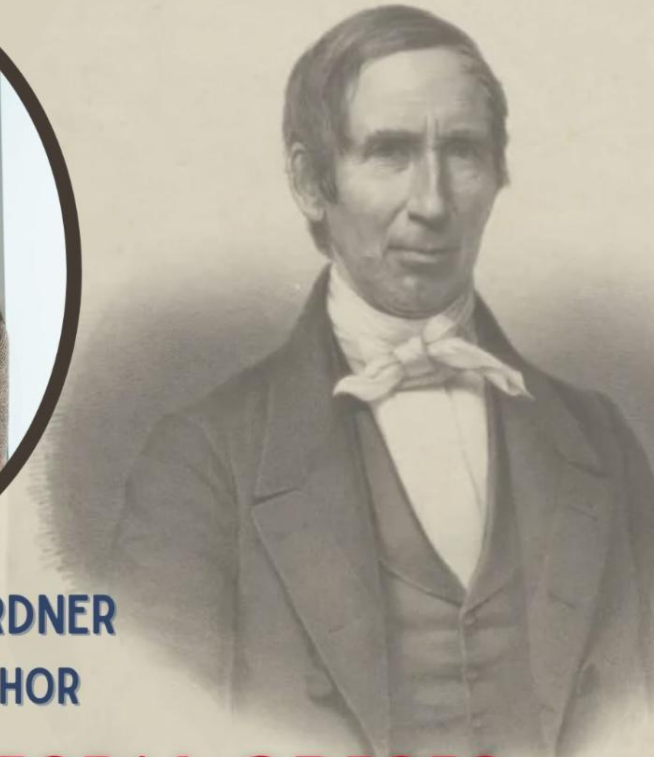
In the book she presents words, images, and stories of how congregations transform into what were churches in decline or plateaued into thriving communities of faith.

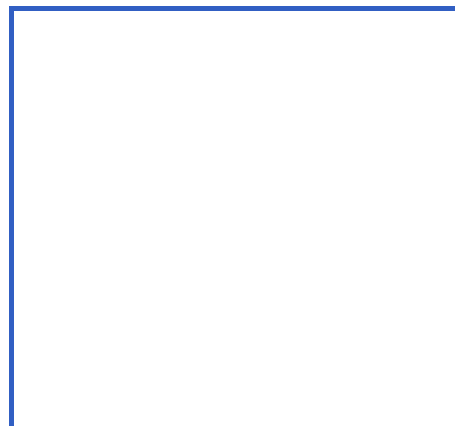

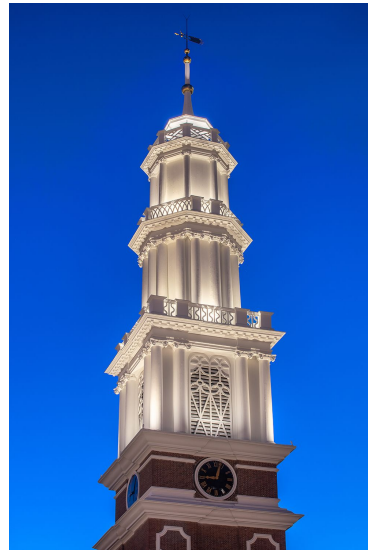
