

A Request for Donations: First Aid Kits

Chris Graesser is working with a group that supports immigrant families. Currently this group is collecting household items for families whose loved ones, often the sole bread winners of the families, have been detained for deportation. Most of these family members live in Hartford and are afraid to leave their homes.

At this time we are collecting first aid kits for these families. These are available at, among other places, Target, Walmart or CVS. If you would like to contribute, please bring one or more kits to Sunday services. Thank you!

From the Visionary Team Fall Updates

The Visionary Team has identified three areas for our community to focus on in the coming program year, based on notes from our May church retreat:

- Increase the engagement of children in worship in multiple ways.
- Create a short-term Faith Formation Strategy Team to create a vision for our ministries with children and youth. The team would work starting in September, would make budget recommendations for the congregational budget meeting in November, and would report to the congregation at our Annual Meeting next spring. We commissioned this working group in worship on Sunday. They will have their first meeting this week and will meet regularly through November.
- Start a small group to move forward with exploring the creation of a

501(c)(3) that will help support our ministries with folks in transition. This group held their first meeting last month; the next meeting is scheduled for October 22. More updates to come!





Save This Date! Transgender Day of Remembrance



Rita Hester was a Black transgender woman, sister, auntie, performer, and poet from Hartford, CT who loved to dance. She was murdered in Allston, MA on November 28, 1998. Her death sparked Transgender Day of Remembrance, a national observance day to recognize transgender people who have been taken by violence.

Gather with community outside of Hartford City Hall at 12:00pm for the reading of a Proclamation.

It's encouraged to take action by promoting anti-violence. Making food more accessible. Developing shelters and housing that are safe. Practicing safer ways of educating. Centering specific types of self help and affirming care such as estate planning and legacy arrangements that accurately aligns, reflects, and respects who we are as human beings.


The Transgender Legacy Flag created by Ephraim Adamz was raised in the Pratt Street Historic District of Hartford, CT from November 20, 2023 to November 28, 2023 in honor of Rita Hester.

On November 28, 2023 communities gathered in Hartford, CT for a Transgender Legacy Ceremony in loving memory of Rita Hester, Monique Thomas, Tyra Hunter, Chanelle Pickett, Gabrielle Pickett, Debra Forte, and Jahaira "Balenciaga" DeAlto."

Last November, Center Church was happy to raise the Transgender Legacy Flag on the corner of Main and Gold to mark Transgender Day of Remembrance 2024.

On November 20, 2025 Center Church will once again raise the Transgender Legacy Flag. Prior to that, however, please join Center Church, Ephraim Adamz, the surviving family of Rita Hester and members of the Black and Brown LGBTQ+ communities as we remember and honor the legacy of those our transgender siblings who have been affected by identity based violence.

On the Imagery of the Advent Series – the focal image of the lantern:

From the creative team at A Sanctified Art:

As we discussed our Advent theme and how hope and fear are interwoven in our lives, a vision emerged: hands gently cupped around candles at a vigil. When we gather at a vigil, fear is often present, weighing on us like a heavy fog. The candle in our hands can feel fragile, insignificant, the flame easily extinguished. But when we turn to our neighbors to spread the light, it multiplies, wrapping the whole community in warmth. The darkness is not eradicated; if anything, it further illuminates the flicker of the candles. In these vigil spaces, grief and fear dance with gratitude and hope. In these spaces, we find courage and unity. We are reminded that God is near. This vision captures our prayer for this Advent series: that it will illuminate both our hopes and our fears and remind us that God is near.

Fear can divide and paralyze us and even be used as a tool for oppression. But what if we formed a different relationship with fear? Can we acknowledge fear without letting it rule us? Might we catalyze our fears into love and action? What if naming our fears helps us see more clearly how God is breaking in and where God is at work?

Join us this Advent. We will gather to remember and hear the familiar stories as we continue to navigate unfamiliar and fear-filled times, insisting on radial, extraordinary and resilient Hope.

A Call to House Meetings






Rev. Joel Hawes, served as the 10th Pastor of Center Church from 1818 to 1864.

These hours are subject to change, and we will do our best to inform you of any departures.


