

From the creative team at A Sanctified Art:

As we discussed our Advent theme and how hope and fear are interwoven in our lives, a vision emerged: hands gently cupped around candles at a vigil. When we gather at a vigil, fear is often present, weighing on us like a heavy fog. The candle in our hands can feel fragile, insignificant, the flame easily extinguished. But when we turn to our neighbors to spread the light, it multiplies, wrapping the whole community in warmth. The darkness is not eradicated; if anything, it further illuminates the flicker of the candles. In these vigil spaces, grief and fear dance with gratitude and hope. In these spaces, we find courage and unity. We are reminded that God is near. This vision captures our prayer for this Advent series: that it will illuminate both our hopes and our fears and remind us that God is near.

Fear can divide and paralyze us and even be used as a tool for oppression. But what if we formed a different relationship with fear? Can we acknowledge fear without letting it rule us? Might we catalyze our fears into love and action? What if naming our fears helps us see more clearly how God is breaking in and where God is at work?

Join us this Advent. We will gather to remember and hear the familiar stories as we continue to navigate unfamiliar and fear-filled times, insisting on radial, extraordinary and resilient Hope.



From the Visionary Team

Fall Updates

The Visionary Team has identified three areas for our community to focus on in the coming program year, based on notes from our May church retreat:

- Increase the engagement of children in worship in multiple ways.
- Create a short-term Faith Formation Strategy Team to create a vision for our ministries with children and youth. The team would work starting in September, would make budget recommendations for the congregational budget meeting in November, and would report to the congregation at our Annual Meeting next spring. We commissioned this working group in worship on Sunday. They will have their first meeting this week and will meet regularly through November.
- Start a small group to move forward with exploring the creation of a 501(c)(3) that will help support our ministries with folks in transition. This group held their first meeting last month; the next meeting is scheduled for October 22. More updates to come!





GHIAA Victories & Follow-Ups

This Fall, GHIAA was able to celebrate some wins:

 Courthouse Protections: <u>HB 8004</u> bars law enforcement from conducting civil arrests without a judicial warrant in state courthouses or on courthouse grounds, and prohibits agents from wearing masks while conducting their duties at courthouses unless medically necessary. This safeguards access to due process in the justice

- system for all of us, and in particular for our immigrant community members. (HB 8004, Sec. 12 and 13)
- Data Protections: <u>HB 8004</u> also prohibits all public agencies and officials from sharing people's personal information unless specifically required by law. This protects every one of us who has shared our information with the state in good faith, and particularly our immigrant community members, including tens of thousands of families who participate in Husky 4 Immigrants, hold drive-only licenses, enroll in school, etc. (<u>HB 8004, Sec. 14</u>)
- Federal Response Fund: <u>HB 8003</u> allocates \$500M from the state budget surplus to make up for loss of federal funds for SNAP, WIC, LIHEAP, health care, school meals, child care assistance, or housing assistance. These funds are available from now through Feb. 4, 2026, when the spring legislative session begins, and their spending is directed by the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management.
- Housing Affordability: <u>HB 8002</u> accomplishes a variety of important steps toward the creation of affordable housing and support for people experiencing homelessness. GHIAA was not working directly on this bill, but it is certainly aligned with our values and priorities around housing affordability. For more details, check out this <u>summary</u> from our friends at the Partnership from Strong Communities.

While we can absolutely celebrate these wins, we also stay focused on the work ahead, too. On the radar ahead, we have:

- Federal Response Fund: making sure that the \$500M that has been set aside is actually spent before the deadline to alleviate the pain CT residents are already feeling from the federal cuts.
- Remote Hearings: allowing people to participate in court appearances remotely, as was done during the pandemic, so that immigrants can remain in a safe location while they show up for court.
- **Protecting Immigrant Health Care:** ensuring that no one in CT loses health coverage, regardless of immigration status.
- State and Local Resources: prohibiting the CT National Guard and other state/local resources from being used for federal immigration enforcement purposes.
- Additional priorities will be developed based on the ongoing work of our GHIAA issue teams.

And lastly, it is important that our elected officials know that we are paying attention to their positions. It is important to thank those leaders who act in alignment with our priorities and values, and to share our disappointment with those who act in opposition.

- We are asking GHIAA leaders to follow up with your elected officials using the following steps: Check to see how your legislators voted on each bill:
 - 1. Immigrant Protections (HB 8004) <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u>
 - 2. Federal Response Fund (HB 8003) <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u>
 - 3. Housing (HB 8002) House and Senate
- Find the contact information for your state representative and senator here
- Send them an email expressing your gratitude and/or disappointment with their votes. You can adapt the following template. Make sure you fill in the blanks with your own information and delete anything

extraneous! As always, feel free to use your own words.


It is with great pleasure that we announce Center Church's formalized partnership with The Official Royal House of Sori.


