

Queer Black History 2026 will educate, entertain, and raise consciousness about the accomplishments and challenges in the lives and loves of living and deceased Black LGBTQ+ people who live and lived in Connecticut. 

Dr. Jenifer Barclay, author of *The Mark of Slavery: Disability, Race, and Gender in Antebellum America* (2021) will be the Spring 2026 guest for Center Church's Fred & Elizabeth Boyajian Lecture Series, "Lest We Forget."

[About the Lecture:](#)

Dr. Barclay's lecture invites us to think about disability as a multifaceted human experience. Historian Jenifer L. Barclay will share poignant examples of how disability shaped enslaved people's daily lives. Enslavement often caused disabling,

debilitating conditions and made disabled people's lives more challenging. Yet, disability also created opportunities for enslaved people to contribute critical labor and support to their beleaguered communities precisely because slaveholders devalued and dismissed them. Barclay's work also makes clear that disability was a potent cultural metaphor incorporated into the political rhetoric of both pro- and antislavery forces. Each group used representations of disabled, enslaved people to evoke pity and garner support for their very different causes, creating an imagined link between blackness and disability that echoed in American society long after slavery's abolition.

Hartford-based international trio, Mad Agnes (Margo Hennebach, Adrienne Jones and Mark Saunders) has been called "genre-bending," refusing to stay within one style but choosing instead to draw upon their varied backgrounds to create a sound of their own. Common to all their work, however, are their signature harmonies (tight as jeans from the dryer!) and carefully crafted arrangements that utilize guitars, mandolin, ukulele, percussion and an adorable pint-sized keyboard. Mad Agnes uses primarily one microphone around which they form and re-form, early-radio style. Their ease with one another onstage invites the audience into their world of human connection and spontaneous fun. Playing together since 2001, they collectively have 12 original CD releases, and have performed at festivals and listening rooms across the US and UK.

From the Property Subcommittee *Winter Updates*

Warm Greetings Center Church,

For the last few months a small group has been meeting together to discuss a plan for addressing the more pressing structural issues related to our two historic properties.

A short but incomplete list we're looking at includes:

- Repairs and Maintenance to the Slate Roof
- Structural and Cosmetic Repairs to the Meetinghouse Roofline
- Drainage and Masonry Repair and Preservation at both properties
- Structural and Cosmetic Repairs to the main entrance of 60 Gold Street
- Water Damage to the south facade, basement ceiling and underground walls of 60 Gold Street

We have completed a survey of the damage with the help of architect Tim Brewer to identify potential Project Managers. We have also begun drafting a Request for Proposal and Qualifications (RFP/Q) to send out to these would-be contractors.

We expect to meet with engineers soon, who can advise and inform us as we move forward. As we move along on the process we will continue to keep the congregation updated. We are currently using Capital Improvement Funds to finance the preliminary stages of our project but as more information becomes available about the full scope and cost of the project, we anticipate fundraising efforts that include grant writing, outside donations and a thorough exploration of other revenue streams.

From the Visionary Team *Winter Updates*

The Visionary Team has identified three areas for our community to focus on in the coming program year, based on notes from our May church retreat:

- Increase the engagement of children in worship in multiple ways.
- Create a short-term Faith Formation Strategy Team to create a vision for our ministries with children and youth. The group met and made budgetary recommendations for how to best fund our growing Faith Formation Ministries.
- Start a small group to move forward with exploring the creation of a 501(c)(3) that will help support our ministries with folks in transition. The group continues to meet regularly and hopes to make a presentation to the congregation on their findings and recommendations at the Annual Meeting in March.

GHIAA Updates - Testify! **Yes, You Can Help!**

Dear GHIAA:

The legislative session is under way, and things are happening quickly. Your voices are critical to advancing our legislative priorities this year. **Two affordable housing bills are in need of your support in the coming days.**

1. Just Cause Eviction Protections

As of midday today, the balance of public written testimony submitted on **Just Cause Eviction Protections (SB 257)** is tilted slightly against us, with about 52% opposed and 48% in favor. We can shift this! We have 21 GHIAA leaders who have submitted testimony so far (thank you!), and if we double that number, we could change the balance to have a majority of testimony in support of this important legislation. You can submit your testimony through March 2, using the template and instructions in our **testimony guide**.

2. YIGBY (Yes In God's Back Yard)

- While we don't yet have a bill number for YIGBY, we believe one will be coming soon, and that a public hearing could follow quickly thereafter. We want to be ready. To that end, we are holding an online training tomorrow, Thursday, February 26, from 7:00–8:30 PM. Here is the Zoom link: **<https://us06web.zoom.us/j/84508673930>**. During this session, we will: Brief you on the YIGBY legislation
- Review the public testimony process
- Work together to draft testimony
- Join with leaders from CONECT to coordinate our efforts

Since the testimony request are coming fast and furious these days, we also want to share a word of encouragement.


If submitting written or oral testimony feels like dropping a penny in a wishing well, you're not alone – but it truly matters.

Legislators can't read every bill or hear all testimony, so when a bill leaves committee, staff prepare a "Joint Favorable Report" summarizing the public hearing. If you scroll through the **Joint Favorable Report linked here** from last year's Just Cause public hearing, you will see GHIAA voices featured prominently, sharing compelling personal stories and a clear moral call to action.


